Registration Tips:

- Class Registrations are on a first come first serve basis with current families getting first choice at classes. Current families should take advantage of early registration dates for the best chance at securing any classes you want for your student(s).
- If you can't remember your log in RESET your password. You will ONLY be able to view and access the registration page once you are logged in.
- Teacher approval is required for registration into Honors Classes. Please review pre-requisites required and then contact us at jana@mudcreekstudio.com for teacher approval PRIOR to registering for honors classes.
- Class registrations are completed online at www.mudcreekstudio.com
 1. To register you must be logged in or if you are a new to Mud Creek then you must first create an account
 2. Click on the register tab and you may begin putting classes into your cart
 3. Class deposits are due at time of registration and are **non-refundable** if you choose to withdraw
 4. Once you have selected all your classes, then click on cart and check out via pay pal
 5. You should receive a confirmation email receipt of your class deposits paid

2023-2024 Procedures for Thursdays at Mud Creek/Mud Creek Studio:

Registration and Deposits:

- Students will be officially registered in a class once the **non-refundable** deposit and registration have been received online. Class deposits now include the previously separated 'facility fee' and are due at time of enrollment.
- Classes are available on a first come first serve basis. Parents and students must agree to follow the procedures and conduct as outlined.
- Registration for honors classes requires teacher approval and pre-requisite requirements. Please contact us at jana@mudcreekstudio.com for teacher approval prior to enrollment

Supervision:

- There will be a minimum of 3 teachers on site at all times.
- Due to the nature of parking and the limitations of space all other adults and children not enrolled in classes should only be on site during the designated drop off and pick up time frames.
- No parent parking will be allowed on the driveway and must remain open for clear and efficient traffic flow for drop off and pick up in the driveway.
- **To respect our neighbors, please refrain from parking along the street or in the cul-de-sacs at either end of Branding Iron Court.**

Drop off and Pick up:

- Students should be dropped off in the designated area on time and promptly picked up at the conclusion of class. ***Students Temperature will be checked at drop off.***
- If a student is consistently picked up late, they may not be allowed to attend future classes. Parents should arrive to pick up their student a few minutes before the designated end time.
- Early drop off will not be allowed. Students should be dropped off no more than 5 minutes prior to class.
- Students are only allowed on site while they are attending their enrolled class.

Tuition:

When enrolling at Mud Creek, you are enrolling and committing to our full- year program of classes. If you choose to drop a class, previously paid tuition is non- refundable. Our teachers are hired and depend on tuition based on that year commitment. To ensure that our teachers are

adequately compensated for their time and commitment to our students, we strictly follow the tuition policy outlined below.

Our yearly tuition for classes are \$400 for a 1 hour and 20 min. course. That roughly works out to \$16 per 1 hour and 20 minute class. Even though that is a bargain for classes, we understand that is a large amount to pay at one time, so we are offering the opportunity to divide the tuition into 3 monthly payments.

You can choose to pay for the yearly course in one or three payments.

If you choose to pay in **3 installments**, this is the tuition payment schedule:

OR If you choose to pay in **1 installment**, the tuition is due at orientation on August 17th.

Class Cancellation:

- In the event that a teacher cannot obtain a substitute and needs to cancel a class due to illness, the teacher will utilize google classroom for instructions with live or recorded interactive instruction.

- If a student is absent, the tuition is not pro-rated. Students must be free of fever, vomiting, and diarrhea for 24 hours before attending classes. In addition, students should not attend classes with positive flu or covid tests and/or symptoms
- If classes need to be cancelled due to inclement weather or a Mud Creek wide sick day, tuition will not be pro-rated and we will meet April 25 or schedule a virtual make up class.
- In the event of cancellation, we will notify via google classroom pages and our private Facebook group.

Conduct:

- Students are expected to come to class prepared and ready to learn.
- Students are to respect all adults, peers and their environment.
- Students should remain in their designated and assigned areas while on site.
- Any discipline issues will be addressed by the teacher directly to the parent.
- If discipline problems persist, the student will not be permitted to continue enrollment in the class.
- Students that become a distraction to the learning environment will not be tolerated.

Honors Classes:

Our goal is to prepare our Mud Creek students for success in college level classes and therefore we will have high expectations for students in these classes.

- To be eligible for enrollment in the middle school and high school honors classes:
 - your student must have maintained an 85 or above average in the pre-requisite class
 - If you are new to Mud Creek, then a teacher recommendation and an 85 or above average is required from your pre-requisite class.
- Students are expected to:

- complete all homework on time in order to be prepared for class
- participate in class discussions
- maintain an 85 or above average in the current class
- Middle school and high school students and parents are required to attend orientation on August 17, 2023 and sign our parent/student/teacher contract of honors class expectations.

Procedure and Liability Form:

Each family will be required to sign the procedures, contact info and liability waiver form to be on file prior to attending classes.

Food and Drink:

- A water bottle (no glass) with a lid is encouraged. Please label with your students name. If your student stays for the whole day please send more than one water bottle.
- No other drinks allowed
- No Gum allowed
- Approved snacks listed below will be allowed for a Snack between classes or during the elementary study hall.

Mud Creek 2023-2024 Honors Class Contract

Mud Creek Honors students are part of a community of dedicated learners. Our honors classes are intended to prepare students for success in HS Dual credit, college courses, and in future experiences. They will develop their ability to analyze, interpret information and communicate ideas to others.

Expectations:

- complete all homework on time in order to be prepared for class
- be prepared and participate in class discussions
- maintain an 85 or above average in the current class
- high standard of academic integrity

Attendance: Honors students are expected to attend class regularly to receive instruction and participate in class discussions. The class misses out when someone is absent and your student misses important learning.

Absences: If you need to be absent, you need to notify your teacher of your absence prior to class. Online work and assignments posted to Google Classroom are still due regardless of absences unless prior arrangements are made with the teacher.

Assignments/Due Dates: Assignments are due according to the assignment dates posted on the class Google Classroom board. Due dates may or may not be on in-person Thursday class days. Students are responsible to check Google Classroom for assignments and turn in assignments on due dates accordingly.

Late Work: late work submitted up to 1 week past due date may receive up to 80% credit, work submitted past 1 week will result in a zero but may still be required for submission.

Resubmitted/Corrected work: Students may resubmit corrected work up to 1 week after assignment is returned. Teachers will notify you of additional credit earned and any other requirements.

Reading: Keeping up with assigned reading is expected and crucial to your success in the class.

Academic Integrity: Cheating or attempted cheating will result in a zero on the assignment, homework, project, test etc... Any written material or ideas that are borrowed, quoted or included from an outside source must be cited. Plagiarism will not be tolerated. Academic integrity offenses will be dealt with between the teacher, student and parent. A second offense could result in loss of course credit and/or suspension from course at full cost of tuition.

Grades: Honors students are expected to maintain an 85 or above grade average in all courses. Quarterly grade report checks will identify student progress and students must be in good standing at the time of report checks.

Probationary: If a student falls below the 85-grade average at grade checks, they will be placed on academic probation. Parents must sign grade report and students must bring grade up to good standing by the next grade check or students will be withdrawn from honors class at full cost of tuition.

Parents: Parents are expected to join Mud Creek Google Classroom boards and monitor student grades and assignments. Parents should notify teachers if their student is going to be absent. While we strive to develop academic independence and student responsibility within their Mud Creek Honors classes, parents should actively monitor their students' progress of assignments and grades through Google Classroom.
